#### From Undecided comes an Unexpected Reunion



o often, we never know the outcome for the young women who come to us with unplanned pregnancies. All the ramifications and risks of abortion have been discussed with them. An ultrasound has been scheduled. We've discussed their goals, ensured they have a strong support system, connected them with community resources, and explored the possibility of adoption.



The ultrasound is a critical part of the process, and, after the appointment, we call to ensure that it went smoothly and to discuss the emotional experience. Many are thrilled to tell us about their baby's movements, heart beating, and whether they're having a boy or girl. Sometimes though, the client skips the appointment. When we follow up, we can be met with unreturned messages, wrong numbers, and sometimes we're even told "I had an abortion." When a client leaves undecided and doesn't return our calls, we're left to ponder the outcome. All we can do is pray that a seed was planted in our client's mind during the counseling session.



We recently encountered an unusual case of not learning the outcome until 16 years later! Lisa\* came to our center in 2007 seeking an abortion. Although she agreed to have an ultrasound, she missed the appointment. Phone calls to her went unanswered. A few weeks ago, however, a woman called about maternity clothes for her 16-year-old daughter. She explained how we had helped her years ago when she was pregnant. Our records indicated that she had left our office "undecided" in 2007. Now, 16 years later, we finally learned of her decision: Lisa continued with her pregnancy! Plus, her daughter -- the child whose life we helped save – was pregnant!



When Lisa and her daughter Riana\* recently visited us, we shared our joy that mom had chosen life for Riana back in 2007. "Oh, thank God I did," she said. "I love her so much!" We counseled Riana on her baby's development, nutrition, and good relationships, including abstinence and marriage. We educated her on the abortion process and the many risks involved. We discussed her support system, the assistance we can offer, and God's plan for her and her child. Riana said she would keep her baby, just like her mother had. Lisa – who we first helped choose life in 2007 – now has a grandchild due this October! We can't wait to meet him or her!



We encouraged Lisa to go with her family to Church. We explained a bit about the Catholic faith and referred them to www.CatholicsComeHome.org as a resource for Catholics and non-Catholics alike. Lisa and Riana left smiling, with a handmade baby blanket, rosary beads, and an appointment for an ultrasound.



Not only did God reunite us with a past client who we helped choose life, but he gave us the privilege to help her child also choose life for her own preborn baby. To see the results of our efforts – 16 years later – should remind all who fight for life that our work is never in vain and can bear fruit in unexpected ways. Sometimes it will be revealed to us, but often it will be known to God alone. Let's move onward for Life together so we can all help save countless generations!



# Sidewalk Advocacy: "Every Sidewalk, Every Soul"



The Dobbs decision that overturned Roe v Wade last June was a glorious victory for the tens of thousands of lives that will be saved from abortion because of this Supreme Court decision. This decision was also a "win" for all the volunteers who, for years, labored in the pro-life movement without ever knowing if this day would come.

However, since last June, Post-Roe America is a rapidly changing landscape. The battle line between states has been drawn, between "the extreme states" where life is protected, vs. the "free for all states" where abortions can be performed through the third trimester and up to the day of delivery.

A short time after, what shocked me, yet did not surprise me, was the depths to which the predatory abortion industry would stoop, flocking to areas where abortion is still unregulated and unrestricted. Chemical abortions have dramatically increased to now over 60% of all abortions. In addition, Planned Parenthood is heavily targeting minors with Transgender Hormone Therapy without parental approval. Women are traveling across state lines to obtain their abortions. There are rumblings that the number of abortion facilities will soon triple – or even quadruple – in New Mexico (a key 'free for all state") according to their Sidewalk Advocates.

As abortion legislation continues to evolve, the rise of the "abortion-tourist state" is playing out all over the country. Many underage women show signs of abuse and may even be victims of sex trafficking (often not being reported) with abortion used as birth control. Some women are even receiving some form of compensation (gift cards for travel, etc.) to obtain their abortions. With these incentives, women feel committed, therefore pressured not to change their mind to parent because it's already been paid for. We witness, quite often at our Smithtown center, cars with out-of-state license plates pulling into the Planned Parenthood diagonally across the street from our center.

With all this unfolding, and New York becoming one of the burgeoning abortion-tourist states, I had an unexplainable tug on my heart to think about what more can we do at the Life Center to intercept and reach these women. No matter the legal status of abortion, pregnant moms still need support! We need to be on the ground and visible for the women in our communities at Planned Parenthoods, hospitals performing abortions, pharmacies, etc.

One solution: task the Life Center to be a training venue to develop more Sidewalk Advocates so there can be more boots on the ground to increase a loving, prayerful, and peaceful presence on every sidewalk, at every abortion facility, to save every soul. With lives literally on the line every day, clearly, this is no time for anyone with the heart for life to take a back seat.

We have witnessed many women arriving to an abortion center that do have a faith background, praying for a sign to not go through with the abortion. Women have "turned around" and left the clinic because **they saw someone praying in front of the facility**. Trained Sidewalk Advocates have a key role in speaking with the women about the numerous resources available at our pregnancy care centers that they may not have known existed and, with the Grace of God, bring them to us.

This movement needs all of us to stay the course, continue praying, and work together to support pregnant women. Please become part of the solution and join our team in this great mission. With God's grace, we can expect miracles.


