

ith Father's Day approaching, I am sharing, with permission, the beautiful thoughts and sentiments about Fatherhood written and sent to us from Robert Natale.

Fear. It's the first emotion I can remember after the initial joy and surprise wore off.

I'm going to be a father. How am I going to be able to do that when I can barely take care of myself?

I am afraid and confused. I see everyone rightfully rushing to help mom and her preborn child, but what about me? Who's going to tell me what I'm supposed to do? I can't do this. I just don't know how. What if I do something wrong?

The first thing to remember is that God loves you. He loved you then, He loves you now, and He will love you always. He loves your child. He has met your preborn baby already and He is sending that child to you. You are bringing a child into the world. A child made in His image. God has chosen you as the father. God does not make mistakes. He will give you the strength and love you need to be an irreplaceable part of that child's life. It's the most important job you will ever have. It will be hard, you won't sleep, you'll worry, you may even grow angry. But you will never regret it.

Money will be tight. Sitters are hard to come by, and carpools and play dates will all seem to be scheduled at the worst possible time. But you won't look back or give up. You'll make it work. The "how" is the best part. Just be yourself. There are no riches, no toys, no games you can give your child that had any more value than your time. That's all it takes.

You're nervous now because while you can hear the heartbeat and look at the sonogram pictures, you don't yet have that natural connection mom has. You can talk to mom's belly and maybe see a kick in response to your voice and as wonderful a feeling that will be for you, it kind of caps out at that.

Until...The moment arrives. Your baby is here and the first time those little fingers wrap around one of yours for comfort, you'll be a changed man. You will feel love in a way you never felt before. Deeper, truer and very, very real. Your love for your child will inspire and motivate you to be the dad God has planned for you to be.

You will mature instantly when you realize there is another human life that is wholly dependent on you. It's more exciting than scary! You'll grow up. You'll gain a heightened sense of responsibility not only for your child, but for yourself as well. You will not want to let that child down.

Just be with them. Your child and mother. Run to the store in the middle of the night for diapers or ice cream. Take your turn feeding so mom can get her very much needed rest. The rewards will be immediate and life affirming. Your face is all your kids need.

Be with them. Play with them. Get silly and goofy. Be the cool dad that's always where he's supposed to be when he's supposed to be there. Always fun. Always teaching and always sharing your experience.

You want your wife to think you're the sexiest man alive? Immediately after you get home from work, get down on the floor and play with your kid. Give mom a break. Any mom will tell you, "that's hot!"

One day you'll be like me, and you'll look back over 26 years and wonder where the time went. You won't remember the puke on your new shirt, the dirty diapers or the time you had to hit the ER at 3AM because junior shoved an eraser up his nose. And if you do, you'll laugh.

But what will stay with you forever, what will keep your heart warm on the coldest days, is remembering that you were a good father. That your love for your family was unconditional. That there was no sacrifice you were not willing to make for them. That your kids grew up as sharing, loving, well-adjusted and happy members of society....Because you were there and you cared.




